SUSEET

SUSEET is a Summer School in European Environmental Taxation that will take place online from 20st to 25th June 2022 with the support of **European Union**.

It is free course where undergraduate students who are achieving their degree in law or economics or postgraduate students (master or Ph.D.) will learn the fundamentals of European environmental taxation, becoming aware of the complex economic and social issues related to this topic. SUSEET has been designed to provide participants with suitable expertise on environmental taxation, useful both for the construction of an academic career and for a professional one, contributing to the creation of a new generation of European environmental tax lawyers and economists. It will provide the occasion for participants coming from all over the world to discuss with eminent professors and experts working in this field.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES OF THE COURSE

- To provide** a comprehensive view on economic and legal basis of environmental taxation;
- To explore** the European constraints to the introduction of fiscal instruments to protect the environment: State Aid rules, freedom of movement, prohibition of discrimination, etc.;
- To illustrate** the multiple interactions between tax and environment in terms of global policies and their economic and social effects;
- To demonstrate** the challenges and new opportunities provided by the circular economy;
- To analyse** energy taxation principles and their concrete application in the framework of the EU energy transition strategy;
- To discuss** the fit for 55 and fiscal mechanisms to support a green and inclusive tax reform.





STRUCTURE OF THE COURSE AND CERTIFICATE OF ATTENDANCE

The summer school is structured around lectures and laboratories in which the theoretical and practical approach will be mixed. The lectures will be followed by laboratories and discussions of European case law and case studies with experts, policymakers and businesses to stimulate debate among the participants.
